

Introduction – all start with two things:


"These things saith" – a description	"I know thy works" - before addressing the

Message – the word Jesus sends to the churches usually fit within four categories:

Good Characteristics	<u>Problems</u>		
Spiritually, what did this church do well?	Spiritually, what was wrong with this church?		
What good thing(s) did Jesus recognize?	What problems did Jesus identify?		
<u>Commands</u>	<u>Promises</u>		
What did God instruct this church to do?	What did God promise this church?		
What commands did they need to follow?	What did Jesus say He would do?

EPHESUS

...thou hast left thy first love. - Revelation 2:4



READ | REVELATION 2: 1-7

- Rev 2:1 Unto the angel of the church of Ephesus write; These things saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand, who walketh in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks;
- 2 I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars:
- 3 And hast borne, and hast patience, and for my name's sake hast laboured, and hast not fainted.
- 4 Nevertheless I have [somewhat] against thee, because thou hast left thy first love.

- 5 Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent.
- 6 But this thou hast, that thou hatest the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.
- 7 He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God.

FACTS & HISTORY

- A large and prominent city on the west coast of Asia Minor
- Paul founded the church in Ephesus and he as well as Aquila, Priscilla and Timothy ministered and labored there (Acts 18-20; 1 Tim. 1:3)
- An important trade center and seaport at the Cayster river
- Largest city in the province with perhaps 300,000 people
- Temple of Artemis or Diana in Ephesus (Acts 19:23-41) was ranked as one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World



The 'terrace houses' at Ephesus, showing how the wealthy lived during the Roman period.



Ephesus was a church that did a lot of great things in their work, church, and ministry but God STILL had an issue with them. Why? Because they left their first love. They left God! They laboured, had patience, and stood for right, but their works were not enough because they didn't love God like they used to or like they should! We have the privilege of serving God (and we should get to work – 1 Cor. 15:58), but this is a real relationship where He wants our excitement, zeal, and passion for Him. He wants us close to Him! There is always something fighting for our affection and attention, but Ephesus shows us we can't let anything get between us and God. No matter what, don't leave your first love!

[Mark 12:28-30] How should we love God? Why do you think this commandment is first?
[Col. 1:14-18] In all things He should have the preeminence. What does that mean?
[Luke 10:38-42] What can we learn from the story of Mary & Martha?




